Three recommendations to protect refugees and make our communities better

On Refugee Rights Day (April 4), the Canadian Council for Refugees is urging the government to resettle more refugees, to process refugee applications more quickly and to treat refugee claimants fairly.

"Refugees are people who are fleeing for their lives and Canada must do more to offer them a safe refuge," said Claire Roque, President. "Opening our doors is not only the right thing to do – it benefits us, since people who come as refugees contribute in so many ways. History shows us that our communities are stronger when we welcome refugees."

On and around April 4, CCR members across the country are visiting Members of Parliament to bring forward key recommendations:

- Resettle 20,000 government-assisted refugees annually.
- Ensure applications of privately sponsored refugees are processed within 12 months.
- Reform the refugee determination system so that all claimants have access to a fair hearing before an expert independent tribunal (the Immigration and Refugee Board).

February 22nd 2018 was the first annual Provincial Day dedicated to raise awareness about the crime of human trafficking. On May 2017 Ontario passed the Anti-Human Trafficking Act, which increases protection for survivors and those at risk of human trafficking. The Act also proclaims February 22 of each year as Human Trafficking Awareness Day in Ontario. Different events were organised across the province. FCJ Refugee Centre joined some of the events in Toronto.



Migrants Workers Mobile Centre

The FCJ Refugee Centre was one of the few organizations in Ontario who received three year funding from the MCSS to continue working with exploited or at risk migrant workers. Currently, there is a lack of services, settlement and/or legal available to migrant workers who are exploited or at risk. To respond to this, the FCJ Refugee Centre received financial support to set up a Migrant workers Mobile Centre.

Migrant Workers Mobile Centre

-Many caregivers are victims of abuse and many migrant workers are mistreated!

- Migrant workers and caregivers can receive support and counselling
- -Do not forget to count your worked hours. If you couldn't take a break because of the intensity of your tasks, or you didn't have time to take it, make a record of those moments, because it will be helpful for future claims or complaints.
- -Don't be afraid when demanding your rights. Do not allow abusive situations to happen. Do you know that if you lose your job, you can remain in Canada until your work permit expires?
- -No one can discriminate and no one can be abusive to you! You have rights!

CCR International Refugee Rights Conference

In June 2018, the Canadian Council for Refugees invites non-governmental organizations and others to attend an international conference in Toronto designed to enhance effectiveness in promoting the human rights of refugees and vulnerable migrants. Representatives of non-governmental organizations (NGOs), academics, government officials, UNHCR representatives, refugees and vulnerable migrants are welcome. Special attention will be given to representation from the Global South.

The conference will provide an opportunity to discuss a wide range of issues facing refugees and other vulnerable migrants.

One of the objectives of the conference is to promote ongoing cross-border networking, knowledge-exchange, strategizing and collaboration among NGOs committed to the rights of refugees and vulnerable migrants, and between NGOs and academics.


FEJ REFUGEE CENTRE TAX CLINIC


