


FCJ REFUGEE CENTRE; WALKING WITH UPROOTED PEOPLE




OUR NEW PROGRAMS; AS INTERSECTIONAL AS OUR COMMUNITY!

- ➤ Take the lead from the community respond to emerging trends.




WHAT IS A SAFE SPACE?



THE FCJ YOUTH TEAM; SUPPORTING THE IMPLEMENTATION AND CREATION OF NEW PROGRAMS



FROM OUR KITCHEN TABLE TO YOURS


From Our Kitchen Table to Yours




