


Food and Income Security Program

We are pleased to let you all know that through our Food Distribution Program we were able to continue providing food hampers to many households around the City and the Greater Toronto Area.

Thanks to the City of Toronto, The Food Distribution Program is currently expanding to support more families and precarious migrants who have been affected by the second wave of Covid-19. Over the last month, our list of families participating in the program grew from 85 families from last year to around 240 houses at the moment. In addition, our routes increased from 5 to 12 in order to expand our reach and serve as many communities as possible, connecting our beautiful city during these very trying times. In tandem with food delivery, our program has also been able to support precarious migrants in a multitude of ways, from providing much needed one time rent assistance, to informing our city's most vulnerable about the COVID-19 virus and how to keep themselves and their families safe.

The Food Distribution Program has allowed our Centre to reach out to those who are uprooted within our community, supporting them as much as possible during these trying times. For this, we are deeply grateful to our volunteers and everyone involved in this program for making this possible.

FREE ENGLISH CLASS



The English teachers have helped the ESL program evolve to a more structured and stable program.

The students need to register, sending an email to esl@fcjrefugeecentre.org using the form below, with their name, email, and which class they want to attend.

For the Beginner English Class we send to the students an email every week with the link and the material that we will use in the class. This material includes basic grammar and vocabulary. We include exercises that we do together in class, while reviewing all the material. The classes are through Zoom platform, and run on Mondays at 2:00pm (except on

long weekends).

For the Intermediate Level Conversation Group the students receive the link every week through the Zoom platform, and the classes are Thursdays at 4:00pm. This is for students who already know the basic grammar and vocabulary but want to practice English and work on their confidence to express themselves in daily life.

COVID TEST:

If you are sick; i.e. you have a fever, dry cough, difficulty breathing, body ache, sore throat, runny nose or if you have been exposed to a known COVID case and you need to be tested, please find below the COVID-19 testing locations: https://covid-19.ontario.ca/assessment-centre-locations You must make an appointment to be tested at all

locations.

COVID TEST RESULTS

People without an Ontario Health Card Number can now access their COVID test results online using the Patient Viewer. The individual will need the testing label that should be provided to them by the COVID-19 Assessment Centre.

FOR EMERGENCIES: Individuals can go to the nearest Emergency Room where they will be attended with no charge fee.

TEMPORARY PATHWAY TO PR

The federal government announced a temporary pathway to permanent residency for refugee claimants working in the health-care sector during the COVID-19 pandemic.

On December 14, 2020, Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) started to accept applications for permanent residence from refugee claimants who work in Canada's health-care sector and provide direct care to patients. Applications will be accepted until August 31, 2021.

The program is open to claimants waiting for their refugee hearing or who have received a negative refugee decision. FCJ Refugee Centre put together a summary of the program in the following document online: https://www.fcjrefugeecentre.org/2020/12/temporary-pathway-to-permanent-residency-summary/

If someone qualifies for the IRCC program and meets Legal Aid Ontario's financial eligibility, they will pay a lawyer who accepts legal aid work to help them with their application.

Beginning January 18, 2021, clients can make applications for this legal aid certificate by calling 1-800-668-8258 from Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Heaven is in her last semester at Seneca College and started her placement position at FCJ Refugee Centre last fall.

My name is Heaven, and I am in my last semester at Seneca College. I am currently assisting clients with their immigration applications (started off with work/study permits and PR now learning Sponsorships). I started my placement in the fall of 2020 (Sept).

In the beginning, I was nervous, I still am! But the team is great at answering all and any questions I may have! This experience has really opened my eyes to how long and difficult the application process can be for some people. I have learnt how difficult and time consuming the immigration process is. I also learnt how to properly navigate the IRCC website and to be patient with it.

When I began my placement at FCJ Refugee Centre last year in February, I was working with the Anti-Human Trafficking team and would also help with the Immigration and Refugee Protection team. Starting in September for my last year at Seneca, I started working with the Immigration and Refugee Protection team. I had heard about all the amazing ways FCJ Refugee Centre helps the Immigrant and Refugee community and I was very excited to begin working with them.

I was able to work with victims and survivors of Human Trafficking and Labour Exploitation by interviewing them on a case-by-case basis, translating documents and helping with applications such as Temporary Resident Permits. I also had the opportunity to conduct focus groups for Migrant Farm Workers in Windsor and Leamington. I also participated in a forum on "International Migrant Trafficking and Exploitation".

With the Protection team, I support clients by helping them fill out application forms such as: work permits, study permits, sponsorships and permanent residence cards. This service allows clients to continue moving forward in their process of obtaining status in Canada and often it lifts some weight off their shoulders.

My experience at FCJ Refugee Centre has been very educational and fulfilling. For example, being able to help make a person's migration journey even just slightly easier and hearing how thankful they are for this help. I've also loved the opportunity to work with the Centre because they are very united. Every member of the Centre is supportive of one another, understanding and extremely hard working. I am grateful to have been able to experience being part of a Centre that is not only a group of working colleagues but a group of people that consider one another like family.



PUBLIC EDUCATION PROGRAM

As one of the main components of our Public Education Program, we continued providing webinars on different topics for anyone who needs information. During this difficult time and responding to community needs, we developed webinars for communities and front-line workers that serve vulnerable newcomer sectors, non-status and precarious migrant populations





We also keep producing BORDERLESS VOICES PODCAST with key information for anyone who needs support.

The Podcast is in English, Spanish and Portuguese.

IRB-RPD VIRTUAL READY TOUR: The IRB-RPD is resuming the Ready Tours and they are now available online.

This is a great opportunity to meet the RPD staff who will explain the refugee hearing process and how to be well prepared for that moment. The conversation includes information on the Remote Refugee Hearings: length, who can participate and technical requirements. This is a unique opportunity for refugee claimants to ask questions to the staff of the RPD.
