INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY: BREAK THE BIAS



For more than 30 years, the FCJ Refugee Centre has been commemorating the resiliency, bravery and strength of refugee and precarious migrant women on International Women's Day. Moreover, on this day we remember our Centre's founding which began by walking in solidarity with refugee and precarious migrant women. For the last 30 years, FCJ Refugee Centre has been a safe haven for women and their children.

As an organization we pause on this day to reflect on the steps and struggles made by all women in their fight for an equitable society. Furthermore, we reflect on the collective courage to denounce a Patriarchal society in which women were not, and in many places to this day are not recognized as persons. This is a day to mark the violations made on women's rights in society, but also to commemorate the women who have been paving the road to emancipation. Additionally, on this day we honour refugee and precarious migrant women, who have made difficult journeys to a new country and who continue to overcome the barriers in building a new life in Canada. Although this is a day to celebrate all women, at FCJ Refugee Centre we also mark this as a day to continue raising awareness around the specific injustices faced by refugee and precarious migrant women.



Today, and every day, the FCJ Refugee Centre continues our call for action. On this International Women's Day we call on all levels of government to acknowledge the valuable work conducted by refugee and precarious migrant women in Canada. We also call on the government to provide holistic and wrap around services to support refugee and precarious migrant women. Most importantly, we are making a call to the community to support and acknowledge the resiliency of refugee and precarious migrant women.

On this International Women's Day, as refugee and precarious migrant women continue to break the bias of what it means to be a woman, we advocate that they are not left behind.

FOOD DISTRIBUTION

We continue supporting precarious populations through the **Food Distribution and Income Security Program.** Since we started this year we are distributing more than 800 baskets of food per month.

The good news for this spring is that the Income assistance was extended until July 2022.

Through this program we able to help with rent or financial assistance to families that do not have access to the provincial or federal support.





Another program that has been a success is the temporary COVID Isolation Emergency Support Fund (COVID IESF). It was established to assist individuals who due to a severe financial hardship are not able to access COVID testing and/or complete the required period of isolation. It has been a huge help for vulnerable populations affected by COVID-19

IMPACT OF THE FOOD DISTRIBUTION AND INCOME ASSITANCE PROGRAM IN THE COMMUNITY

Gabriela Nestor and Angel Reyes experienced significant struggles during the Covid-19 pandemic. They faced a difficult time when they got infected by COVID - 19.

During their isolation time, they were beneficiaries of the food distribution and rent support. It allowed them to endure the difficult times they were going through.

In tandem with food delivery, our program has also been able to support precarious migrants in a multitude of ways, from providing much needed one time rent assistance, to informing our city's most vulnerable about the COVID-19 virus and how to keep themselves and their families safe.

PRIMARY CARE CLINIC

The 2nd semester of 2021 was a very important season for the Primary Care Clinic of the FCJ Refugee Centre, where we continue serving non-insured people. The Inner City Health Associates keep supporting us as funders of our Clinic. In 2021 we provided more than 650 medical appointments, (Family MD, Psychiatric Assessments and Regular Immunization Clinics).

We coordinate and provided the COVID-19 Vaccination Clinics providing more than 800 doses of the vaccine for people without OHIP living in Ontario.

One of the programs we have in our Agenda for 2022 is to continue providing regular immunization clinics for children without OHIP in Ontario, as the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted many programs in the City.









Due to the pandemic another group that has been impacted are International Students and Visitors without medical insurance. Our Clinic has been supporting them also by providing free Health Care.







Our Clinic offers services by appointment only on Fridays and Saturdays. However, the staff and the clinic coordinator works from Monday to Friday to provide assistance to everyone in need. If you don't have a health care provider and need to see a Doctor, please call 416-469-9754 ext.230 to receive the orientation needed.

The Primary Care Clinic of the FCJ Refugee Centre is working hard by building strong relationships with the Community Health Centres, Specialist Services and some Walk-in clinics to continue growing our network and support for our Community.

Also we continue helping clients with IFHP to connect with different clinics in the City to be able to get Family Doctor services.

As part of the targets for 2022, we are working hard in order to continue working to get the Psychiatric Program for people without OHIP and hopefully a PEDIATRIC Monthly Clinic coming soon too.

Despite the pandemic, many specialty clinics such as dental, mental health and physical therapy clinics have approached us to offer their services to people both with and without OHIP. It is a great achievement since we currently see that there is a more generalized interest in helping the population regardless of the status of the person.

WOMEN'S PROGRAM

At FCJ Refugee Centre we are committed to approaching women through a peer led model that will provide them with holistic information and access to wrap around services and support.

The goal of our weekly sessions is for participants to engage in community building and social connection. Sessions will provide a safe space and tight knit community for migrant women. This will allow the opportunity to form friendships, encourage healing, build awareness and promote resilience.

Weekly sessions include a number of planned workshops such as: utilizing art therapy to deal with anxiety, self-care tips, how to protect your mental wellbeing and group therapy sessions.
