

Mixed Feelings

However, there are some things I disagree about in the Canadian System, and the simple reason is because of it's bureaucracy and the hypocritical treatment they have with immigrants and refugee people, even though they say they are an "inclusive" country, I can see they're not. There's subtle racism and xenophobia treatment they have with immigrants, but not if you are white-cis-heterosexual-men, obviously right? In this country, I have no legal papers with me more than a white-almost-useless-paper that is useless to get an ID, that they don't want to give me, in the country I LIVE IN. And sadly, that tells me a lot about this government, who gives a damn for the immigrants, even though Canada is Canada because of us.

I was just a girl... a girl with dark skin, puffy hair, and an accent. I looked at my reflection in the mirror, and asked why...

Why can't my hair blow in the wind. What I grew up watching in the movies was now in front of me, and I wondered why... why can't I be as beautiful as them. But I was just a girl who never knew the beauty and value she carried in her skin.

I was just a girl, who traveled 8,145 miles for better life, better education, and a new place to call home. In a crowd of hundreds, you pretended not to see me. You sat next to me, yet never knew me.

But I was just a girl, who loved movies like you, who loved games like you, who wanted to be included just like you.















