Thanks to Bag of Toronto for choosing FCJ Refugee Centre as the charity of this year in the Oakwood neighborhood.



Family Reunification



A successful case of family reunification of a former resident of FCJ Refugee Centre from Afghanistan. She came alone to one of our transitional houses in 2020 and after being accepted as a refugee, we helped her to start with the family reunification process. It was a long process, Two years later after been accepted as a refugee, she could reunite with her two sons and husband. However she is still waiting for her daughter.

The detrimental impact of long waits for reunion with family members is huge.

The Canadian Council for Refugees (CCR) called on the federal government to increase the immigration levels so that refugees are not forced to wait years to be reunited with their immediate family members.
