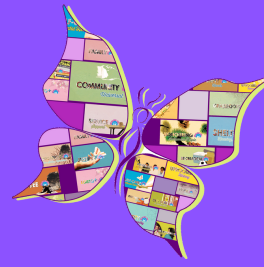


## How you can help

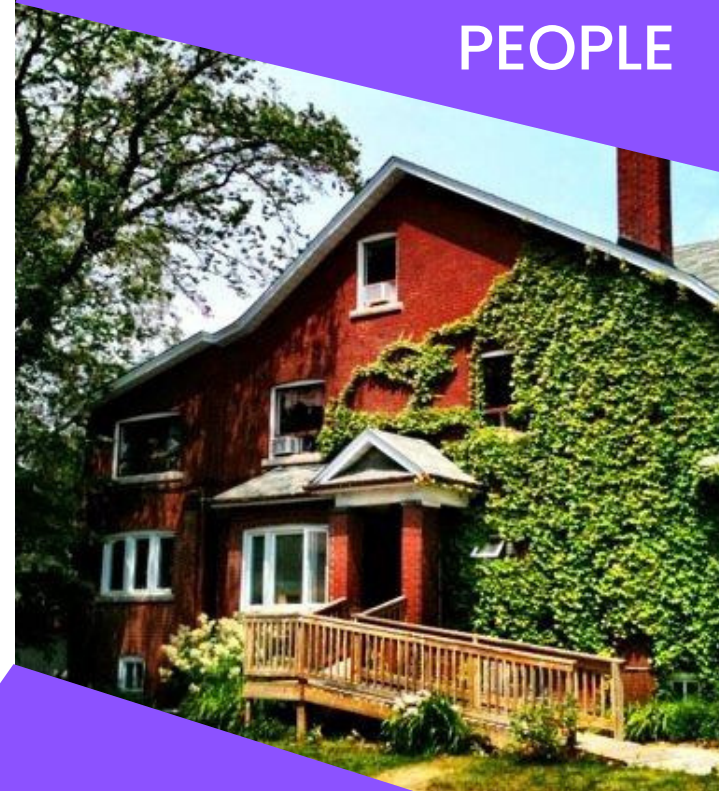

# About us

## OUR MANDATE

FCJ Refugee Centre opens its doors to all women, children and men, who have been forced to leave their home, their family, their country, in search of a safe place. We offer temporary housing for women and children, as well as counselling and assistance to refugees and refugee claimants, and to those in need of other services to help them integrate into Canadian society.



## OUR HISTORY

FCJ Refugee Centre opened its doors in 1991 with two dormitories for women in need of protection. We currently offer a wide variety of programs to refugees and anyone who is at risk

The Centre has its origins in a project of the Faithful Companions of Jesus (FCJ sisters).



# What are we offering?

## IMMIGRATION HELP AND REFUGEE PROTECTION

- We welcome anyone asking for support regarding immigration status
- Refugee process support
- Guidance and support for applications such as sponsorship, humanitarian and compassionate reasons, work permit, IFH, PRA, refugee appeal, travel documents, legal aid application, etc.

We believe that the refugee experience begins from the moment they had to leave their country and continue until they obtain citizenship. For this reason, we have developed an integrated model of services for unprotected people and offer temporary housing for women and children.
